On the holy night of Maundy Thursday, also known as Holy Thursday, we follow the "mandate" of Jesus, ("maundy" being a shortened form of the Latin word "mandatum," which means "command"). Our observance commemorates the final <u>Passover</u> meal with Jesus and His disciples on the night before his crucifixion.

Maundy Thursday begins the Three Days of the Easter Triduum. The three days are from dusk on Holy Thursday to dusk on Good Friday (day one), dusk on Good Friday to dusk on Holy Saturday (day two), and dusk on Holy Saturday to dusk on Easter Sunday (day three).
